How to prepare a presentation for journal club

Length

10-15 minutes MAX

→ translates to ~10-12 slides

Slide setup

- → Minimum text other than direct quotes
- → Figures from the paper

Ideas

- → Check out the journal
- → Supplementary materials

Structure of the talk

- 1. Some broader context
- 2. Specific context (e.g. study species)
- 3. Aims of the study
- 4. 1-2 slides of methods (don't overdo this!)
- 5. Results: focus on figures

Points for discussion:

- 6. Something expected / something unexpected
- 7. Strengths and weaknesses
- 8. Conservation implications

Conservation implications: how useful is this paper in practice?

Does it address a real problem? A local or broader one?

Is it directly or indirectly relevant for policy/management?

How can we translate its results into outcomes?
